The Government of Ghana *has received* financing from the World Bank toward the cost of the West Africa Food System Resilience Program(FSRP 2) and intends to apply part of the proceeds toward payments under the contract for The supply of smart seeds for Smallholder Farmers: “For this contract, the Borrower shall process the payments using the Direct Payment disbursement method, as defined in the World Bank’s Disbursement Guidelines for Investment Project Financing, except for those payments, which the contract provides to be made through letter of credit.”
2. The Ministry of Food and Agriculture now invites sealed Bids from eligible Bidders for Supply and delivery of Smart Seeds for Smallholder Farmers as follows:
