INTRODUCTION

- 1. The Government of Ghana (GoG) has received funding from the World Bank to implement the second phase of a multi-programmatic approach for the West Africa Food System Resilience Program (FSRP2) across the major food baskets of Ghana. The second phase includes Ghana, Sierra Leone and Chad and three regional partners, (ECOWAS¹, CILSS² and CORAF³).
- 2. The development objective of the FSRP2 is to increase preparedness against food insecurity and improve the resilience of food systems in Ghana. The Food System Resilience Project is organized around five core distinct but interrelated components to help achieve the objectives of the project. The project components include:
- 3. The project is structured under five components as follows.
 - Component 1: Digital Advisory Services for Agriculture and Food Crisis Prevention and Management
 - Component 2: Sustainability and Adaptive Capacity of the Food System's Productive Base
 - Component 3: Regional Food Market Integration and Trade
 - Component 4: Contingent Emergency Response Component CERC
 - Component 5: Project Management

4. The Ministry of Food and Agriculture (MoFA) is the government agency responsible for the implementation of the project, together with technical partners such as Research Institutions, Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) as well as Private Sector organisations.

OBJECTIVE OF THE CONSULTANCY ASSIGNMENT

- 5. The main objective of the consultancy is to develop a comprehensive National Irrigation Policy and a Strategic Plan for GIDA, under MOFA for a 5-year period (2025 2029).
- 6. Specific objectives are as follows:
 - 6.2 Review, analyse evolving needs of Ghana in irrigation, and prepare new National Irrigation Policy for MOFA. This should be based on National Irrigation Policy document prepared in 2019 and reflect current trends in irrigation development and management including modernization, commercialization, the concept of Scheme Management Entities (SMEs), Environmental and Social Risk Management (ESRM) and Water Users Associations (WUAs). The review should also cover the intended role of GIDA acting as a regulator, appropriateness of GIDA's core functions and organizational capacity.
 - 6.3 Prepare a Strategic Plan (2025 2029) for GIDA, under MOFA. This should consider the previous GIDA Strategic Plan (2016-2020) and prepare a new 5-Year Strategic Plan for GIDA for the period 2025-2029, taking into account the need to transform GIDA from its current state into a more effective State-Owned Enterprise (SOE). This should include an investment roadmap, identification of partners, identification of scale of investments, geospatial planning elements, etc.

SCOPE OF THE ASSIGNMENT

- 7. The assignment is in two parts with a view towards significant expansion and modernization of irrigation in Ghana. The first part is the development of the National Irrigation Policy based on the one first prepared in 2012 and subsequently revised in 2019. The second part of the assignment is the preparation of a Strategic Plan for GIDA covering a 5-year period of 2025 to 2029.
- 8. The consultant will therefore work closely with GIDA Management and Technical team, MOFA, FSRP and other stakeholders such as WUAs, WRC, etc. The assignment will entail the following, among others:

9. Develop New National Irrigation Policy

- i) Undertake a review the 2012 and 2019 editions of the National Irrigation Policy to understand the context of development of both documents and identify the significant changes between both documents.
- ii) Conduct an extensive desk review of all relevant reports, technical papers, among others to understand the current trends of irrigation development and management from the global, African, and national context, as well as assess the potential impacts of climate change and vulnerabilities on irrigation in Ghana.
- iii) Evaluate the existing draft National Irrigation Policy (2019 edition) to identify gaps in relation to the current trends in irrigation development and management including the regulatory role of GIDA, modernization, commercialization, the concept of Scheme Management Entities (SMEs), Environmental and Social Risk Management (ESRM) and Water Users Associations (WUAs), and private sector participation.

- iv) Conduct stakeholder engagements of all relevant stakeholders including GIDA technical staff, MoFA, MOF, WUAs, Service Providers (i.e., contractors, suppliers, etc.), large-scale/commercial and smallholder farmers, Hydrological Services Directorate (HSD), academic and research institutions, regulatory bodies like Water Resources Commission (WRC), Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), and other private sector players, Development Partners to gather information on their perspectives on the direction for irrigation development and management in Ghana.
- v) Create a new policy based on outcomes of desk reviews and engagement with stakeholders, and experience in (iv) above.
- vi) Assess the current resources and capacities, identify potential new sources for resources, required to implement the revised policy both at institutional and national levels and make recommendations on requisite investments and management decisions.
- vii) Prepare implementation plan and relevant documents required for submission and approval of revised National Irrigation Policy.

10. Development of Strategic Plan for GIDA (2025-2029)

- i) Assess or evaluate the implementation of the strategic plan for 2016 -2020 in order to identify the gaps in attaining the objectives in the restructuring and modernization of GIDA.
- ii) Assess existing challenges within the irrigation sub-sector as outlined in the new irrigation policy for consideration into this strategic plan.
- iii) Formulate strategies and solutions which are aligned to existing relevant policy documents to address these gaps. These should include an investment roadmap, organizational capacity needs, potential partners, regulatory needs, geospatial planning elements, etc.
- iv) Prepare an implementation plan with budget and timelines, and specific Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) to facilitate monitoring. Develop a results framework to guide evaluation of the Strategic Plan
- v) Develop a human resource plan for assessing all categories of staff for training sufficiency.
